# Weather Delays and Closures Review

The past two mild winters we have been fortunate that delays and closures have been minimal. Now twice in one week! Just saying that I have not missed my alarm going off at 5AM! With the recent weather, it is probably time to again review that mystery of how those Liberal Leave, 1-Hour Delay, 2-Hour Delay and Closure calls are made for Adams County government.

Making a call the night before during a blinding blizzard is easy. But most times during inclement weather, I am up at 5:00 AM checking existing conditions, weather forecast, weather radar, local delays/closures, and taking several operational realities into consideration. By 5:30AM, I confer with Judge George (or acting) and we come to terms with the best safety/operational decision based on the information we have at the time. Most of the time we get it right – but it is not an exact science with changing conditions. A few degrees one way or the other, or miscalculations on when precipitation begins and ends, can make a difference between being a genius or a Bozo! Also, what's happening in the Gettysburg area may be somewhat different in Upper Adams, Buchanan Valley, Mt Carmel, Chambersburg, Hanover, or Dillsburg. When the weather event is scheduled to take place during commuter hours, or during the workday, (like today), it also makes the decision much more difficult.

Then comes the next step of calling IT to put the information on the website and notifying numerous staff and media outlets. With my long-time IT early morning weather contact Loretta Weaver retired, Phil Walter now has the distinct pleasure of hearing from me at 5:30AM to post the status on the County website. We strive to have these notifications and postings all done by 5:45AM, in consideration of staff that needs to travel some distance, and consideration of maintenance staff needs to address parking lots and sidewalks. So next time there is inclement weather, and you wake up and look at the County website or WGAL for Adams County government delays or closures, and you don't agree - Judge George made the call!

## **Adams County IDA & ACGA Appointees**

The Board of Commissioners made several appointments at their public meeting. The Board appointed Max Felty, Gettysburg Tours, to the Adams County Industrial Development Authority Board of Directors for a five-year term, effective January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2028. We also appointed Michael Showers, Keystone Fur Dressing, Inc. to fill a vacancy on the Adams County General Authority Board of Directors, for a five-year term, effective January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2028.

## IT Update

The Information Technology Department recently completed a change in the County's backup and disaster recovery software. As part of this change, the County will benefit from a software solution that requires less complex configuration and manual intervention to keep the backup and disaster recovery environment secure. The new software package also includes a dedicated incident response team that is available 24x7x365 to respond to cybersecurity incidents. This change in backup software directly aligns with the County's efforts to reduce cybersecurity risk, improve business continuity, and protect County owned data from loss or destruction.
