

## Caseload Highlights Definitions and Notes

This report is intended to provide timely information about the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on court caseloads. Caseload figures are those reported by the judicial districts and have not been verified. Accordingly, they are preliminary and subject to change. This second, monthly edition has been expanded to include dispositions. - Monthly caseload statistics reports are due to AOPC from the judicial districts on the 15<sup>th</sup> of the following month;
   June 2020 reports are due July 15<sup>th</sup> and this report will be updated for early August release.
- Baseline is the average number of filings or dispositions in that month for the past three years.
- **Month to month percent change** is the difference between the baseline compared to the same month in 2020.
- Year to date, or **YTD percent change** is the difference between the cumulative baseline compared to the total number of cases filed so far in 2020.
- Missing is the percent of cases not yet reported by the judicial districts; it's calculated as the average percent of the statewide total that a non-reporting district contributes. Data from CPCMS and MDJS systems (criminal, dependency, delinquency & MDJ courts) are extracted from the systems in real time, so there are no missing cases, though there may be docketing delays that will increase figures in later Highlights report versions.

# Common Pleas Criminal: Filings



PA State Police statistics show total "Calls for Service" were up by 71% in late May compared to a "Pre-COVID-19 Baseline" week in late February. At the same time, Arrests fell 64%, Criminal Offenses were down 76% and Property Crimes decreased by 80%.










**49%** of probation departments reported that **no intakes were occurring** as of March 2020.





# Common Pleas Family Court: Pending Inventory of Cases Awaiting Disposition

While the adjudication of pending family cases abruptly slowed in the early weeks of the judicial emergency, filings also decreased significantly.

As a result, the number of custody and divorce cases awaiting disposition are comparable to baseline figures, though the cases in the inventory are likely to be older as a result of pandemic related delays.


The processing of PFA cases is governed by statutory timelines, however it appears their processing has slowed given that the number of pending matters awaiting action at the end of May was 55% higher than the norm, despite 40% fewer filings.







# Common Pleas Orphans' Court: Pending Inventory of Cases Awaiting Disposition

While the adjudication of pending Orphans' Court matters abruptly slowed during the early weeks of the judicial emergency, filings also decreased significantly.

As a result, the number of cases awaiting disposition are **slightly fewer than the baseline months of past years**, though the cases in the inventory are likely to be older as a result of pandemic related delays.

### **COMMON PLEAS CIVIL:**

15 counties have yet to submit their Civil Court Report for May 2020 (as of 6/30/2020).

- These counties account for 19% of the total of Civil filings per year.
  - ✓ Of note, counties missing from the accounting above include Bucks County (accounts for 6% of the state total), Delaware County (accounts for 5% of the state total), and Erie County (accounts for 2% of the state total).

### **COMMON PLEAS FAMILY:**

- Custody & Divorce: for May 2020, 15 counties have not yet reported data (as of 6/30/2020).
- For Custody cases, these 15 counties account for 11% of the Custody filings annually.
  - ✓ Of note, counties yet to submit include Chester County, Luzerne County and Westmoreland County, each accounting for 2% of the statewide total of Custody cases filed.
  - ✓ Of the 15 counties yet to report, 7 account for less than 1% of the total state filings annually.
- For Divorce cases, these 15 counties account for 14% of the total annual filings.
  - ✓ Of note, missing counties include Chester County (accounts for 3.4% of the state total), Cumberland County (accounts for f2.5% of the state total), and Juniata, McKean, and Westmoreland Counties, each accounting for 1.5% of the total annual filings.
- PFA: for June 2020, 13 counties have not yet reported data (as of 6/30/2020).
  - ✓ These counties account for 17% of the state total based on the three year average (baseline figure).
  - ✓ Of note, counties that have not submitted include Allegheny County (9% of the annual total), Luzerne County (4% of the annual total), and Lackawanna County (2% of the annual total) for a total of 15% of the annual PFA filings.

### COMMON PLEAS ORPHANS' COURT:

- 11 counties have yet to submit data for May (as of 6/30/2020). These 11 counties account for 17% of the total annual Orphans' Court filings.
- Adoptions: the 11 counties yet to submit account for 22% of the total annual filings.
  - ✓ Of note, counties yet to submit include Luzerne & Mercer Counties, both accounting for 3% of annual filings, and Washington & Westmoreland Counties, both accounting for 2% of the annual filings.
- Relinquishments/Terminations: the 11 counties account for 20% of the total annual filings.
  - ✓ Of note, counties yet to submit include Mercer County (accounting for 6% of annual filings), Westmoreland County (accounting for 4 % of annual filings) and Luzerne (accounting for 3% of the annual filings).
- Guardianship: the 11 counties account for 11% of the total annual filings.
  - ✓ Of note, counties yet to submit include Luzerne & Westmoreland Counties, both accounting for 3% of the annual filings, and Mercer County (accounting for 2% of the total annual filings).
