



PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD FOR THE ADAMS COUNTY DRAFT 2023-2026 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) – OPENING SOON!

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) proposes where projected transportation funding sources will be spent over the next four (4) years in all of Adams County. The types of eligible projects include repaving projects, bridge rehabilitation projects, major interchange upgrades, intersection improvements, and new road alignments. FHWA LOCAL AID SUPPORT INNOVATION EXCHANGE - DUST PALLIATIVES FOR UNPAVED ROADS: TUESDAY, MAY 17 - 2:00-3:30 PM

Dust palliatives are agents or mixtures that are applied to unpaved roads to reduce airborne dust. The amount of dust, and therefore the type of palliative - or road stabilizer, depends on the climate, amount of precipitation, and surface disturbance. Fugitive dust is known for its impacts to human and wildlife health, yet palliatives also come at a risk of environmental harm. Palliatives can be expensive and can erode quickly if not applied correctly for the right soil conditions.
