Governor Josh Shapiro Unveils Budget Initiative

Pennsylvania 67 counties listened with interest as Governor Shapiro presented his first budget, sharing his vision for what he called common-sense investments to make Pennsylvania communities safer and healthier, create real opportunity, build an economy that works for all, and ensure every child has access to a quality education. Shapiro said the budget was constructed to lower costs and cut taxes for Pennsylvanians. He addressed cutting red tape, speeding up permitting, and supporting business. He wants to begin the long process of making our education system fairer so that every child in this Commonwealth has a shot. At the March 3rd Commissioners Public Meeting *Land Conservancy Of Adams (LCAC) County Month* & *Pennsylvania 4-H Week* were both recognized with proclamations by the commissioners. Both groups were on-hand to address the Board, receive proclamations and get photographs of the occasion.

LCAC is in its 28th year of operation having recorded 180 easements enabling the preservation of 1200 acres of open space. They are a dedicated and passionate group that does noble work!
