A RESOLUTION APPROVING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 147(f) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED, THE ISSUANCE OF A BOND TO FINANCE A PROJECT FOR WELLSPAN HEALTH AND ITS AFFILIATES; AND REPEALING ALL PRIOR INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS

WHEREAS, the General Authority of Southcentral Pennsylvania (the "Authority") has approved the issuance of its Revenue Refunding Bond, Series 2021 (WellSpan Health Obligated Group) (the "Bond") to finance the Project (defined below) on behalf of the WellSpan Entities defined below; and

WHEREAS, WellSpan Health ("WellSpan"), York Hospital, The Gettysburg Hospital, Ephrata Community Hospital, WellSpan Surgery & Rehabilitation Hospital, WellSpan Health Care Services, WellSpan Properties, Inc., The Good Samaritan Hospital of Lebanon, Pennsylvania, The Chambersburg Hospital and their affiliates (collectively, the "WellSpan Entities"), each of which is a Pennsylvania nonprofit corporation and an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), are the owners and users of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the WellSpan Entities have requested the Authority to issue the Bond in an amount not to exceed \$45,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the proceeds of the Bond, which will be issued as a "qualified 501(c)(3) bond" as defined in Section 145 of the Code for healthcare facilities, will be used to current refund the Authority's Revenue Refunding Bond, Series 2021 (WellSpan Health Obligated Group) (the "Taxable Bond"), the proceeds of which were used to (A) refund the Authority's outstanding Revenue Bonds, Series 2014A (WellSpan Health Obligated Group) maturing after June 1, 2024; and (B) pay the costs of issuing the Taxable Bond and related costs (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, a portion of the proceeds of the Bond will be used to refinance the cost of facilities located on portions of the facilities of the WellSpan Entities in (i) the County of York, Pennsylvania, (ii) the County of Lancaster, Pennsylvania, (iii) the County of Adams, Pennsylvania (the "Adams County Facilities"), and (iv) the County of Lebanon, Pennsylvania, each of which is described in further detail in Exhibit A attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, Section 147(f) of the Code requires that the applicable elected representative of the governmental unit on behalf of which bonds are issued and of each governmental unit having jurisdiction over the area in which any facilities with respect to which financing is to be provided from the net proceeds of such bonds is located, approve bonds after a public hearing in order for a private activity bond to be a qualified bond under the Code; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 147(f) of the Code, a joint public hearing was held by the Authority in connection with the issuance of the Bond on April 3, 2024 in the City of York, Pennsylvania following publication of a notice of such hearing (in the form of the Notice of Hearing) on the primary public website of Adams County which was posted at least seven days prior to such hearing and the Authority has reported that no one from the general public appeared at such hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Adams (the "Board of County Commissioners"), is the applicable elected representative of the governmental unit having jurisdiction over the area in which the Adams County Facilities are located and such Board of County Commissioners has determined to approve the issuance by the Authority of the Bonds to finance the Project;

WHEREAS, the County is not making any determinations as to whether the Bond may be validly or legally authorized and issued in order to finance the Project; and

WHEREAS, the County is not obligated to pay, and neither the faith and credit nor taxing power of the County is pledged to the payment of the principal or redemption price, if any, of and interest on the Bond;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Adams as follows:

 $\underline{SECTION\ 1.} \qquad \text{The issuance of the Bond and the financing of the Project located in the County is hereby approved for purposes of Section 147(f) of the Code.}$

SECTION 2. The Board of County Commissioners hereby pursuant to Section 147(f) of the Code, hereby approves the issuance by the Authority of the Bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$45,000,000 to finance the Project. The Board of County Commissioners hereby acknowledge and confirm that a transcript of the TEFRA Hearing has been provided to the Board of County Commissioners for the record.

SECTION 3. The foregoing approval is for the purposes of the applicable provisions of the Code as aforesaid, and does not constitute approval for any permit, license or zoning required for the construction or occupancy of any facilities to be financed or refinanced as part of the Project.

SECTION 4. The credit of the County of Adams is not to be used for the security of the Bonds and the County of Adams will have no liability for any payment of principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds.

SECTION 5. All actions of this Board of County Commissioners taken in conformity with the intents and purposes of this Resolution are ratified, confirmed and approved in all respects.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> This Resolution shall take effect immediately. All prior ordinances or resolutions or portions thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Kenetha Hansen, representing the Authority, called to order on April 3, 2024 at 9:00 am a public hearing regarding the Authority's Financing of a project to be owned and operated by WellSpan Health, and its affiliate entities.

The following individuals were in attendance: Richard Harley, VP, Treasury Management, WellSpan Health and J. Kenetha Hansen, Assistant Secretary, General Authority of Southcentral Pennsylvania.

The hearing convened for the purpose of discussing the Financing and the project to be funded with the proceeds of the Financing pursuant under Section 147 (f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

Kenetha Hansen declared that the notice of the hearing (the "Notice") was duly advertised on the County of York's website, commencing March 20, 2024 and the Authority's website commencing March 25, 2024.

The hearing is being held on behalf of the Counties of York, Adams, Lebanon and Lancaster. The Notice was posted on the websites for Adams County commencing March 26,2024 and Lebanon County commencing on March 21, 2024, and was published in the newspaper of general circulation on March 26, 2024 in Lancaster County as evidenced by screenshots or certifications and the proof of publication.

Ms. Hansen conducted the public hearing. Rick Harley introduced himself and summarized the Financing and the project.

The proceeds of the Financing, which will be issued as a "qualified 501(c)(3) bond" as defined in Section 145 of the Code for hospital and medical facilities, will be used to refinance the Authority's Revenue Refunding Bond, Series 2021 (WellSpan Health Obligated Group) (the "Taxable Bond"), the proceeds of which were used to (a) refund the Authority's outstanding Revenue Bonds, Series 2014A (WellSpan Health Obligated Group) maturing after June 1, 2024; and (b) pay the costs of issuing the Taxable Bond and related costs.

It is anticipated that the proceeds of the Financing will be used to finance or refinance property at locations in York County, Adams County, Lancaster County and Lebanon County described in the Notice.

No additional comments or testimony were offered regarding the Financing or the project.

The public hearing was adjourned at 9:02 am.
