

PENNSYLVANIA'S 12-YEAR PROGRAM TRANSPORTATION SURVEY RESULTS

The 2023 Public Comment Period for the update of the 12-Year Program began on March 1, 2023, and concluded on April 30, 2023, generating 10,573 survey responses. 4,248 mapped points were also received from survey participants, with 127 already being addressed by planned projects. Although the Public Comment Period has concluded, the Transportation Survey will remain open until September 30, 2023, in order to provide the public with additional opportunities to get involved in statewide and regional planning processes. PENNDOT'S 2023 TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES SET-ASIDE PROGRAM: DRAFT APPLICATIONS DUE JULY 17TH

The Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside (TASA) program provides funding for projects and activities defined as transportation alternatives, including on- and off-road pedestrian and bicycle facilities, infrastructure projects for improving non-driver access

to public transportation and enhanced mobility, community improvement activities, and environmental mitigation, trails that serve a transportation purpose, and safe routes to school projects. Draft applications are due July 17th by 4PM and final applications are due by September 15th by 4PM.

GRANT OPPORTUNITY: SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL (SS4A)

The purpose of SS4A grants is to improve roadway safety by significantly reducing or eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries through safety action plan development and refinement and implementation focused on all users, including pedestrians, bicyclists, public transportation users, motorists, personal conveyance and micromobility users, and commercial vehicle operators. The program provides funding to develop the tools to help strengthen a community's approach to roadway safety and save lives and is designed to meet the needs of diverse local, Tribal, and regional communities that differ dramatically in size, location, and experience administering Federal funding.
