#### IT Network Tested By PA National Guard

The Adams County Information Technology Department recently completed a five-day cyberse-

curity assessment with the PA National Guard. As part of this

engagement, cybersecurity specialists from the National Guard used various ethi-

cal hacking techniques to test the County's cyber defenses. In addition, the cybersecurity specialists educated County IT staff on the techniques and tools that are commonly used by the bad actors to gain unauthorized access. The final day of the engagement was spent completing an out brief with County and Court administration that will help shape future cybersecurity strategic plans.

The County is very appreciative to have had the opportunity to participate in this zero-cost cyber assessment by the PA National Guard.

## EDC Adams Response & Recovery Fund Grant Approved

At Wednesday's Commissioners Meeting the Adams Economic Development Corporation (EDC) AARF grant was approved for \$323,100. The proposed purpose of the grant is to create a revolving loan fund to support affordable housing through down payment assistance for qualified individuals who work in Adams County and seek to purchase a home in Adams County. The approval means the applicant has met and submitted all the necessary requirements and documentation and has met the program guidelines.

The Adams County Board of Commissioners had previously recommended 14 applicants be considered for approval totaling \$5M. Thus far 9 of the 14 have been brought to the Board for final approval. County Planning and the County Solicitor's office continue to work diligently with the recommended applicants, and we thank them for their work on behalf of our constituents!
